PROGRAMMING

S.P.E.A.R.

This fall, we're launching a pilot program called S.P.E.A.R. SPEAR stands for Skills for Personal Empowerment, Advocacy, and Resilience. The program aims to promote physical and emotional well-being, enhance confidence, reduce the incidence of violence, and empower LGBTQ+ individuals to become advocates for themselves and their peers.

SPEAR is open to all Gonzaga students who identify as part of the LGBTQ+ community. the program will focus on building practical self-defense skills, mindfulness techniques, emotional regulation, assertiveness, and upstander training. Instructors for each component are members of the community.

The physical and self-defense training will be off campus. Nyne Bar & Bistro has generously offered their large space for training when closed for business. While a "bar" might seem unconventional, the large dance floor affords great space to work and the inviting rainbow atmosphere will feel more welcoming than typical campus (AKA bland) training spaces. We're grateful for a new partner and our students are very enthusiastic about this hands on (hands off!) new programming.

If you know any students who could benefit from joining the cohort, send them our way! If SPEAR is a success like we predict, we hope to apply for a Federal grant available through the Department of Homeland Security to expand the training within the community.

Also, if you know any instructors who conduct training inline with the SPEAR goals also send them our way! We're looking for new ways to holistically build resilience in the community.



Spring Book Fair

This summer, we were awarded a JASPA (Jesuit Association of Student Personnel Administrators) Innovation Grant to put on a Queer Culture and Book Fair on campus. Our goal is to have the fair sometime in early Spring term (look for it in February). Soon, we will meet with a variety of faculty, staff, and students interested in shaping how the fair will look, what books we will display, how attendees can purchase, and where our supply will be stored for check out.
